Tallanstown, Co. Louth

Overall Development Approach:

Tallanstown is very welcome to the 2010 National Tidy Towns Competition. Thank you for your comprehensive submission and supporting documents including copies of your newsletters from the past year. The annotated map showing the location of your projects for this year's adjudication was a most helpful guide for the adjudicator. You have a long and successful history of participation in the competition and the dedication and enthusiasm of your committee is evident both in the submission and in the works on the ground. Well done in maintaining the exceptionally high committee membership given the size of your village. The level of support you receive from your community and the enthusiasm shown for attending work evenings are also exceptional and well done in mobilising this voluntary army. The emphasis you put on engaging with the younger generation in the town is reflected in their success in various environmental programmes and we wonder if you have considered including a pupil representative from the school as a member of the committee? Your dedicated public relations officer has been busy keeping up the high profile of the town and for next year's submission perhaps you could include a montage of press clippings from the previous year to show us how you are getting your message across to the wider community. The website is another very useful resource for you to use to garner support and the adjudicator thought it was very well laid out and informative. Consideration could be given to the provision of a link from the website to your development plan and a map showing projects you hope to focus on for the coming year. An opportunity for residents to comment on the plan and to perhaps suggest

areas for you to focus on would make it a truly democratic document. This will be especially useful as you begin to prepare for the next development plan.

The Built Environment:

The wall behind the Tallanstown water feature is certainly filling up with awards and we have no doubt that it will be added to further, given the standards of presentation throughout the village. This water feature is a fine example of a simply designed modern addition that is complemented by the contemporary planting which surrounds it. The use of high quality materials here is essential to its success, however be careful in how this area is maintained. A small repair to the cobble surround was completed using a new type of mortar and brings attention to the repair which was not I'm sure the intention. However this should in time weather down and not stand out so. The mix of traditional and sensitively designed modern additions combine to create a lovely picture in this tranquil rural location. The stone bridge is a lovely feature and creates a suitable sense of arrival to the core village area. The restoration of the Louth Arms and the exposure of the stone wall at the façade have been very sensitively done and do indeed complement the façade of the Old School House. As part of any future works to the frontage of the Louth Arms, consideration could be given to the incorporation of the roller shutter within the building to improve its appearance when this part of the establishment is closed. The school house really is the focus of community activity for you and was a hive of activity on adjudication day. Builders were commencing works to the school and we look

forward to the completion of the works here for next year's submission. The expansion of the heritage trail was noted and the adjudicator was pleased to see that the leaflets were available in the dispensing units by the visitor information sign. The use of the burgundy colour as a unifying theme throughout the town works well for you and the new colour palette devised for the core village areas will further help unify the village centre. Well done on the effort you have undertaken to raise the considerable sum required for the Sir Vere Foster sculpture. It sits well in the village.

Landscaping:

The standard of landscaping throughout the village was once again very high and well done to all involved in the considerable work that has gone into this level of finish. While the planting at the main traffic island was dominated by your seasonal display the newer structural planting beds were also admired. However the adjudicator was a little puzzled by the strategy of leaving the old stump here to commemorate an old tree that once stood in this spot. Would the planting of a new tree to signify the onward growth of the village not be a more suitable approach to take? Your commitment to the improvement of the landscape structure of the village by the planting of new trees is to be commended, however it is important to ensure that all new trees are maintained and watered especially during the first few years of establishment. Two dead trees by the town sign on the Ardee Road should be removed and replanted over the coming autumn. The jewel in the crown for you in this category has to be Maguire Park. The standards of maintenance here were again exceptional. The restful contemporary planting at the sensory garden was particularly admired. The adjudicator wondered if this restful and natural approach to planting should be the theme here. The bright bedding plants in the stone beds

looked a little out of place in this beautiful spot and this lively planting colour palette should perhaps be best kept to within the busy town square area or perhaps at the entrances to the park. Once again the seasonal colour displays and hanging baskets on individual premises and resident's homes all contribute to the high standards here. Well done in taking into account problem areas such as the unfinished development by Glyde View when setting out your work programme. The planters here help lift this site as a short term measure, however we wondered about the use of the images on the printed panels at the Dundalk Road and the ivy images at the sewage plant? Be sure to monitor the condition of these panels as they are only a short term measure and as they fade could easily become an issue for you.

Wildlife and Natural Amenities:

The dead hedge hotel was much admired and fits in very well on your very informative ecology trail. Now that some of the elements such as the insect hotel have been in place for a while, have you done a survey to see how much wildlife they have attracted? This could be done in conjunction with the local school. The sensory garden is a really lovely addition and the water feature here was working well. The beer garden to the rear of the Louth Arms is such a peaceful spot and helps connect the river into the village. An impressive bird house was also admired here. We wish you well in your continued attempts to develop a riverside walk as the River Glyde really is a hidden gem within the village. Could the owner of the plot of land on the approach to the bridge from the Glyde Road be persuaded to remove the tall non-native evergreen screen here? This would open out the vista to the river for passing pedestrians on the bridge and help reconnect the river visually with the town as you attempt to develop a more physical connection through the walk.

Litter Control:

Well done in all your efforts in this category. The structured approach you have taken to both the organisation of litter patrols and the ongoing analysis of littering patterns have helped you reach the high standards on the ground. Your emphasis on communicating the anti-litter message to the whole community and the liaison with the younger generation is very much the way to go here. The area opposite the Old School House has the potential to cause litter problems from passers-by, so pay attention to this area particularly in future litter patrols.

Waste Minimisation:

This is a category in which you have spearheaded many initiatives and the inclusive nature of your approach to this category shows in the numbers of projects that include both pupils, residents and now businesses with your proposed workshop in collaboration with Voice. The bring centre in the village is a thing of beauty in itself with the witty and informative banners getting the recycling message across in a positive way. Can the pull-in area here be extended as on adjudication day two cars were having difficulty finding space to park without blocking the carriageway? It makes sense to site the community composter here and we look forward to seeing this in place for next year. The display done by the local children demonstrating the rate of composition of various materials, in the Credit Union window, was a joy to see and very informative. Well done to all involved with this.

Tidiness:

Once again the high standards of maintenance and planning contribute to a very tidy town. The standard of boundaries, street furniture and premises all contribute to keeping the built fabric of the village in top form. The

maintenance of the landscape structure also adds to this and the verges and hedges within the town were all looking well. We note that you have had a number of trees in the village pruned as part of your ongoing maintenance. This should extend to the trees at the picnic area. The canopy of the tree beside the picnic sign should be raised as it is obscuring the view to the sign from the road. The new lamp standards are a welcome addition to the streetscape.

Residential Areas:

Once again the residential areas and individual homes in the village were presented to a very high standard. The more established residential areas such as Cherrywood Park and Chestnut Grove are maturing nicely. Continued liaison with and support for the residents of Glyde View in the treatment of the unfinished areas here is recommended. The entrance planter at Tallansfield Manor was admired and we note that you have planted additional trees here. Within the core of the estate the boundary to the rear of the gardens is very prominent. Could perhaps climbers be established to the concrete wall section here to soften its impact onto the central open space?

Roads, Streets and Back Areas:

The approaches to the village were very well maintained and the planters to the circular stone beds on the approach from Ardee were admired. On this approach please continue verge cutting just past the graveyard to the speed limit signs as they are the first indicator of your approaching village. The welcome signs were nicely detailed and reflect the design of the central water feature. It was noted that a number of residents had gathered opposite the entrance to Tallansfield Manor to catch a bus.

General Impression:

Tallanstown has an idyllic rural charm that has been enhanced by the considered approach you have taken to projects within the village area. You have managed to carry out works that complement your rural setting without overpowering or detracting from it. Well done on this. Also the level of community involvement you enjoy is wonderful. All involved with this year's entry are warmly thanked and congratulated for their efforts and wished well in 2011.

Second Round Adjudication:

I was very pleased to be invited to revisit Tallanstown as second adjudicator in the 2010 Tidy Towns competition after an absence of several years. Tallanstown is exemplary, proving that through the initiative, imagination and sheer hard work of a small community what seemed, a quarter of a century ago, to be an unremarkable village has revealed itself as anything but. It started, as I recall, with tree planting, mainly along the approach roads; then old stone walls were restored, greens were laid out with shrubberies and flowerbeds in residential areas and an ancient and neglected motte or look-out mound was recognised for what it is and became the centrepiece of a public garden. An old graveyard was cleared, its limestone gateway re-established and old tombstones revealed. Simultaneously, householders in both 19th and 20th century estates began to take added pride in their homes, and now all are attractively presented. The modest public buildings were reinstated and shown to be first class examples from an era in which rural Ireland was starting to reassert itself; the church which was rebuilt in its present form immediately following Catholic Emancipation and the School built just a few years later are very handsome. In very recent years the Tidy Towns Committee has been instrumental in laying out walks that

take in the natural amenities of the area and has encouraged the drive towards waste minimisation. An enormously important feature has been the participation of the school – its pupils, teachers and parents. If there is now perhaps a potential for the over-decoration of the open spaces, it is certain that the good taste of the committee will ensure that this does not become over-indulgence. I am probably one of the last of the generation of Irish schoolchildren who learned to write in the 'Vere Foster Copy Book'; it is, therefore, heartening to see that Foster is suitably commemorated in sculpture in the village. Congratulations to the people of Tallanstown on their many initiatives and achievements and best wishes for the continuation of these.
